General Discussion Items: See Below

Updates from Hugh Clark, Mercer County Trails Association and Shenango River Watchers, on the Bike Trail and Halfway Road launch grant progress. Thank you for funding two projects. The Greenville Bike Trail is completed from West Main Street in Greenville north along the river to Porter Road.

From the Bike Trail they built a spur in Riverside Park to connect to Thiel College sports fields. At Porter Road, they are working with St. Paul Homes to build a spur east to the soccer fields. For the Halfway Road boat launch, he asked for help with title work and identifying land ownership for property between land owned by Greenville Borough (Right of Way) and the river. Commissioners asked Solicitor and Chief Clerk to assist with research. Per Conservation District permitting is required to continue work on the boat launch (not bike trail) due to proximity to the river.

To connect the trail to Jamestown, they'd have 4 miles to complete on the trail, with a number of individual landowner agreements to resolve.

Welcome to Tom Weber (PrimeCare CEO) and Frank Komykowski (Sr. VP), Chuck Luffey and Dawn Salsberry from PrimeCare, medical/MH service providers for the jail.

Introduced Use of Courthouse Grounds application from "Indivisible Mercer County," a group wanting to gather and to commemorate victims from Parkland FL. Application included a letter of request to waive the insurance certificate.

Logan objected to waiver request as the County is obligated to protect County property on behalf of all citizens as a whole. Exposing the County to liability from hosting a particular group would not be consistent with our overall responsibility. Solicitor commented that applicant should produce an affidavit or notarized document disclosing enough information concerning the formation of the group and its resources so that a decision may be made. Decision was tabled pending receipt of further information.

Greenburg commented that Mercer County fared well in the re-districting and is still intact in the 16th District. Butler County was divided into three separate districts including splitting a precinct.
