The Commissioners appreciate and acknowledge receipt of a donation from the Greenville American Legion in the amount of \$50 for the Veterans ID Card program in the Recorder of Deeds office. Logan expressed a thank you to the community who contribute toward many Mercer County programs including "Shop with a Cop", "Teen Safe Driving Competition" and the "Mercer County K-9". He confirmed that these are voluntary contributions and there is no obligation on behalf of the public to contribute. Recently a JPO program that provides behavioral incentives to certain youth has been approached as a recipient of donations. No funds have been receipted to date.

The Commissioners are impressed with the volunteerism and generosity of Mercer County residents who are actively involved in supporting these programs.

"Hard to Recycle Event" sponsored by the Lawrence-Mercer County Recycling/Sold Waste Department is scheduled for 9/22/2018 at Jefferson Township fairground. Signs will be posted at the Courthouse. The event is from 10 am—1pm. There will be three lines for better traffic flow this year. Collection items include electronics, appliances, batteries, and tires.

Greenburg notes that the next demo of voting machines scheduled for August 29th may include as many as seven other counties. Mercer County will host the event. He also stated that the Dept. of State will not certify any machines with direct recording electronic (DREs) of votes. A scanner recording of a vote is deemed acceptable. The proposed life cycle of the new voting machines is 6-7 years. Voting equipment will always be an ongoing expense.

There is a critical need for election reform. Counties need to save money in how elections are delivered. Greenburg is part of a roundtable discussion across the Commonwealth to address this need. Logan thanked Greenburg for his knowledgeable participation in the process. Logan again confirmed that the Mercer County voting machines are not connected to the internet and are safe.

Unfortunately new voting systems become vulnerable as soon as they are released because of rogue programmers. Mercer County will continue to deliver safe elections. Until legislative reform is in place, any replacement system including "off the shelf" products may be more costly to the county.

Treasurer White reported there are 12,000 doe licenses left. Expected mailing on this third round of licensing is expected to be about 9/10/2018. An applicant can verify their status on the PA Game Commission website.

The Commissioners said that Mercer County will be considering advertisement for an RFP for a Body Scanner for the jail. Recently at the State Correctional Facility employees were exposed to an unknown substance. It is unfortunate that the cost to address illicit drugs is so high. They urge parents to communicate with children to stay away from drugs.

The Commissioners have viewed several scanners and the addition of X-Ray (radiographs) could make it more efficient to detect powders, plastics, explosives and contraband.
