ENGINEER'S REPORT

Plantation Park – Dan Goncz reported that the average daily flow for May, 2019 was about 55 EDU's and 46 EDU's year-to-date for 2019. Dan will provide a summary on EDU's (based on flow) for each of the pump stations at the next meeting.

Thompson Rd. Pump Station – Nothing else has been done at this pump station.

OPERATOR'S REPORT

10.87 Ton of sludge was hauled out in April, 2019.

Grinder pump call-outs, (including grease that was pumped at Talbot's, Dairy Queen and Margarita King)

A letter will be sent out each year to the commercial customers regarding grease traps being cleaned out and providing proof to the Authority in a timely manner, and a letter to residential customers regarding the do's and don'ts of grinder pump care.

OLD BUSINESS

- **1.** Aqua Water Shut-Off Agreement Matthew McConnell was to make contact. He was not present at this meeting and will report at the July 9, 2019 meeting.
- **2.** Cummins Generator Invoices We are waiting to hear back from Tom Scheutz regarding the revised invoice(s).

NEW BUSINESS

- **1. 2018 Audit** Norb Dietrich from Black, Bashor & Porsch, LLP was present to discuss the 2018 Audit. Norb briefly went over the report with the Board. No discrepancies were found. Each entity represented was presented with a copy of the audit to give their Secretary to keep on file. A copy is also filed in the Authority office.
- **2. Asset Reserve Accounts** –Also, under the terms of the loan from USDA, the <u>debt service reserve is</u> <u>required to have \$1,636.88 month deposited into a restricted account</u> until the balance reaches the minimum of one annual payment or <u>\$180,892</u>. The <u>short lived asset reserve is to have a monthly deposit of \$3,582.25 for the term of the loan</u>. This account is to be used for repairs/replacements at the plant as needed only. Linda Thomas from RUS emailed this to me reminding us of the terms of our account. *A motion was made by Walt Darraugh and seconded by Robert Gregory to approve the opening of these (2) accounts. Motion carried unanimously.
