ENGINEER'S REPORT

There was no written Engineer's Report due to computer issues.

The plant met its' effluent limits, the average daily flow for the month of May 2020 was 0.076 mgd. on a 150,000/gal/day permit.

The UV System was cleaned and cleared water off of the digesters.

Only (2) grinder pump call outs. One was on Court St.

At the plant, the ph level of the raw sewage coming in is normal but then drops significantly throughout the process which is one of the reasons the beds are not drying. We have made provisions for the alkalinity adjustment, but we never purchased the alkalinity equipment.

*A motion was made by Walt Darraugh and seconded by Robert Gregory to look into the alkalinity equipment needed and the cost and also check with Lake Latonka to see if we can borrow their tank. Motion carried unanimously.

Aqua Water is coming in today to see if they can determine why the ph level drops after it reaches the plant.

Thompson Pump Station – There is more garbage than ever in the wet well. It was pumped once and then it needed done again (2) weeks later. Homer is no longer able to pump this tank with so much debris present. Maintenance is cleaning the bar screen (3) times a day but it's just not working. Jim will look into the cost to have another company (Powell) with bigger equipment to pump the tank. He believes it will be around \$1000/trip. There was discussion on purchasing and installing a mechanical bar screen. *A motion was made by Walt Darraugh and seconded by Robert Gregory to table this issue until next month when all of the information discussed has been gathered on the best way to handle the Thompson Rd. Pump Station. Motion carried. Matthew McConnell abstained from the vote.

OLD BUSINESS

Customers Delinquent >\$7,000. – There are currently (12) customers who are delinquent over \$7,000.00. No action taken. Tabled until the August meeting.

Aqua Water Service Termination Agreement – We are required under our USDA loan to have an agreement in place, even if we never use it. No action taken. Tabled until the August meeting.

Robert & Barbara Mills, Terrence & Jean Mills Property – Timber Village. Dan reported that the problem has been resolved.
