General Discussion Items: See Below.

Request for Use of Courthouse Grounds to post two 4'X 8' signs for the Mercer Area Library's Used Book Sale the week of May 16th. Request declined.

Update on Emergency Rental Assistance Program (ERAP) Grant. \$80,782.78 issued as of April 30th to four Landlords benefiting eighteen Tenants. Seventy-seven applications are pending representing approximately four hundred Tenants. An additional \$70,605.67 will be issued this week to twelve Landlords benefiting sixteen Tenants.

Announcement of SBA application opening for \$28.6 Billion Restaurant Revitalization Fund. The Small Business Administration began registrations on April 30th at 9 a.m. EDT and opened applications on May 3rd at noon EDT for the Restaurant Revitalization Fund. The online application will remain open to any eligible establishment until all funds are exhausted. Although the application is sent directly to SBA, Penn-Northwest Development Corporation (PNDC) will provide support to any business owner who requests application assistance.

Commissioners thanked the Chief Clerk and Fiscal Department for their participation in creating templates and a clear process for grant management. This is reflective of the process used by Penn-Northwest Development Corporation and the County Hospitality Industry Revitalization Program (CHIRP).

Commissioners announced that PA CareerLink is participating with twenty (20) local restaurants to host a Job Fair on May 10th and 11th with preference given to Veterans. There will be onsite interviews.

Commissioners presented an update on Broadband expansion in Mercer County. Two local companies are providing wireless service and are working through technical challenges presented by terrain obstruction issues. No Limits Broadband and Airwave Technologies are working to provide access to subscribers. No Limits has reduced the cost of its subscription to assist subscribers. Those subscribers within range of a tower may not receive a signal at 100%

strength. To date sixty (60) subscribers have been connected and have provided positive feedback.

Northwest Economic Development Commission has a multi-layer mapping initiative that includes Mercer County. It is used to identify Broadband unserved and underserved areas. Commissioners are focused on matching it with the providers' resources to identify target areas for investment as funding becomes available.

Commissioners are coordinating efforts with neighboring counties to not duplicate services. Commissioners have assisted cable companies to gain approval from utility companies for access to poles to expand the company's service area. Wifi access is as important as water and electricity to people building single family homes. Being connected is considered a basic utility. Commissioners are focused on the goal of providing Broadband coverage across Mercer County.

Commissioner announced that Prime Care Medical is scheduled to receive 2,000 Johnson & Johnson vaccines to be used for their client facilities. This will enable vaccination of Mercer County Jail inmate population.
