ENGINEER'S REPORT

The flows for 2020: Plantation Park is at 55 edu's, which is what we have been charging them. The treatment plant meter was out of service September-November and part of December. It's back online now and Dan will estimate the flows for the Wasteload Management Report. This report is due to DEP 3/31/2021.

OPERATOR'S REPORT

The plant operated within its permit limits for the month of November/2020. The flow meter is back in operation. Sludge was cleaned off of beds 3 and 4. All 4 drying beds were then poured. The fire extinguishers were updated/inspected. The pump stations are all operating properly and there were (2) call outs. There was discussion on what to do temporarily with the debris coming out of the pump station at the jail. Dan will contact Matt with IWC and see if we can get a roll off box.

OLD BUSINESS

Re: PUC Report – Karen reported that the (2) \$1500 fines did not belong to NCWJMA, they belonged to National Fuel. There are now (4) of us that received a violation. Karen sent an email stating we are disputing the allegations. They will not be meeting in January, hopefully they will meet in February or later. They will notify us of the next hearing date.

Re: Loan for Mechanical Bar Screen – FNB does not need a municipal guarantee if we borrow the money through them. There are (5) things that we will need to do if we borrow the money through Rural Development. 1.75%/40 years is the current rate through RD. FNB is at 2.29%/5 years tax free. Dan will have something put together for the board to look at, at the 2/9/2021 meeting.
